### Meals on Wheels\*

Hot, nutritious balanced noontime meals delivered Monday through Friday in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties.

### Congregate Meals

Hot, nutritious balanced lunches served to adults age 60 and older at numerous locations throughout Escambia County and Santa Rosa Counties.

### Adult Day Health Care Center\*

The only licensed adult day health care center in Northwest Florida. The center provides relief for caregivers and a protective environment for seniors with physical and cognitive impairments.

### Foster Grandparent Program

Provides opportunities for those over 60 with limited incomes to love, support and mentor children in a school environment. A small stipend and annual physicals are provided.

### Senior Companion Program

Provides opportunities for those over 60 with limited incomes to help their peers live independently. A small stipend and annual physicals are provided.

### Case Management

Serves as a link between clients and the community resources that make independent living possible.

### Retired & Senior Volunteer Program

RSVP matches the skills and interests of volunteers age 55 and older with the needs of community not-for-profit organizations.

### Recreation Services

Offers special programs and activities for seniors including Rise-n-Stride—our mall walking program, and Camp Adventure—a getaway for seniors.

### Rural Services

Council on Aging operates senior centers in Cantonment and Century. These centers serve as hubs of activity and assistance for area seniors
